Status of Ebola Outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo up to 9 June 2019)

Screening at PoE in Uganda


- One EVD case reported in Uganda at DRC Border
- In DRC EVD 68 cases last week cases (compared 88,121 in the last 2 weeks respectively with 33 death.
 - Transmission active 240 cases in 13 health zones from 71/ (39.6% of 179 health areas) 19 May -9 June 2019 period
 - Preliminary data for 10th June 9 news case &7/18 contacts listed
 - Cumulative EVD cases 2062 Death 1390 CFR 67%
 - 117 009 contacts registered & and 15 509 under surveillance.
 - Average daily 1406 reported 1311 (93%) investigated
 - 124,825 vaccinated in DRC.

Challenges: Mistrust & insecurity stopping transmission?

- onset to admission 6 days
- 29 May 2019 in a vehicle intercepted with body of EVD case with 4 on board.

Tanzania EVD Readiness Assessment 29th may-6th June 2019

Objectives

- To conduct EVD preparedness and readiness assessment using the standard KPI check list.
- To improve the capacities of different key thematic areas
- To establish evidence based recommendations to strengthen health system resilience against EVD
- Advocacy for resource mobilization to scale up EVD preparedness and readiness in the high-risk regions

Methodology

- Courtesy call to top officials
- KPI checklist with RHMTs
- Site visits at PoEs and Health facilities to PoE (Songwe, Kasumulu & Tunduma)
- Feedback to authorities through debriefing &presentations

Conclusion & Recommendation from EVD readiness Assessment

EVD preparedness and readiness in regions is low.

 - ➤ How should we scale up EVD readiness in partnership with government of Tanzania?

Recommendation

➤ MOH needs more support to strengthen coordination of all thematic areas with special focus on surveillance at Regional and District levels.



Current EVD situation & planned activities in the United Republic of Tanzania


- Screening is on-going at 30 POEs in

- No Alert reported last week, < 20 alerts reported in about a year</p>

- Airports






SITUATION UPDATES ON CHOLERA & DENGUE

- Week ending 7June 2019, 55 cases with zero death compared to 33 with 2 deaths the previous week
- Reporting district; Ilala, Temeke, Kinondoni, Ubungo & Kigamboni in Dar es Salaam. Tanga region zero cases.
- Since 25 Jan 2019, a cumulative of 365 cases, 5 deaths (CFR 1.4%) reported
- 15/195 districts in Tz have reported a case.








SITUATION DENGUE OUTBREAK IN TANZANIA

- 300 cases, zero deaths reported from;
 - Dar es salaam (224) Tanga (21),
 Pwani (38) and Morogoro (1) Kagera (2)
- Cumulative 5011 cases 3215 confirmed & 3 deaths CFR 0.06%
- Regions reporting dengue;
 - Dar(4749 case, two deaths), Tanga(174), Pwani (69), Morogoro (8), Kagera (5), Arush (3), Kilimanjaro (1), and Singida (1).





ACTION TAKEN FOR OUTBREAKS IN TZ

Dengue:

- Supported development costed response plan for Dengue outbreak in Dar es salaam
- Advocate for Integrated Vector Management

Challenge: No fogging machine and Acteric 500 EC

Cholera:

- Distribution of aqua tablets for water treatment in the affected districts
- WHO Supported 141 RDTs Kits
- Preposition of Medical supplies
- Support the affected districts come out with cholera response plan

Challenge: Need for reagents for sequencing and genotyping

Coordination of outbreak response:

- ❖ National coordination meeting supported (video Conferencing with Dodoma)
- Through EOC and PORALG, provide support to districts which are reporting
- WHO and partners continue to monitor surveillance data and trends for all outbreaks
