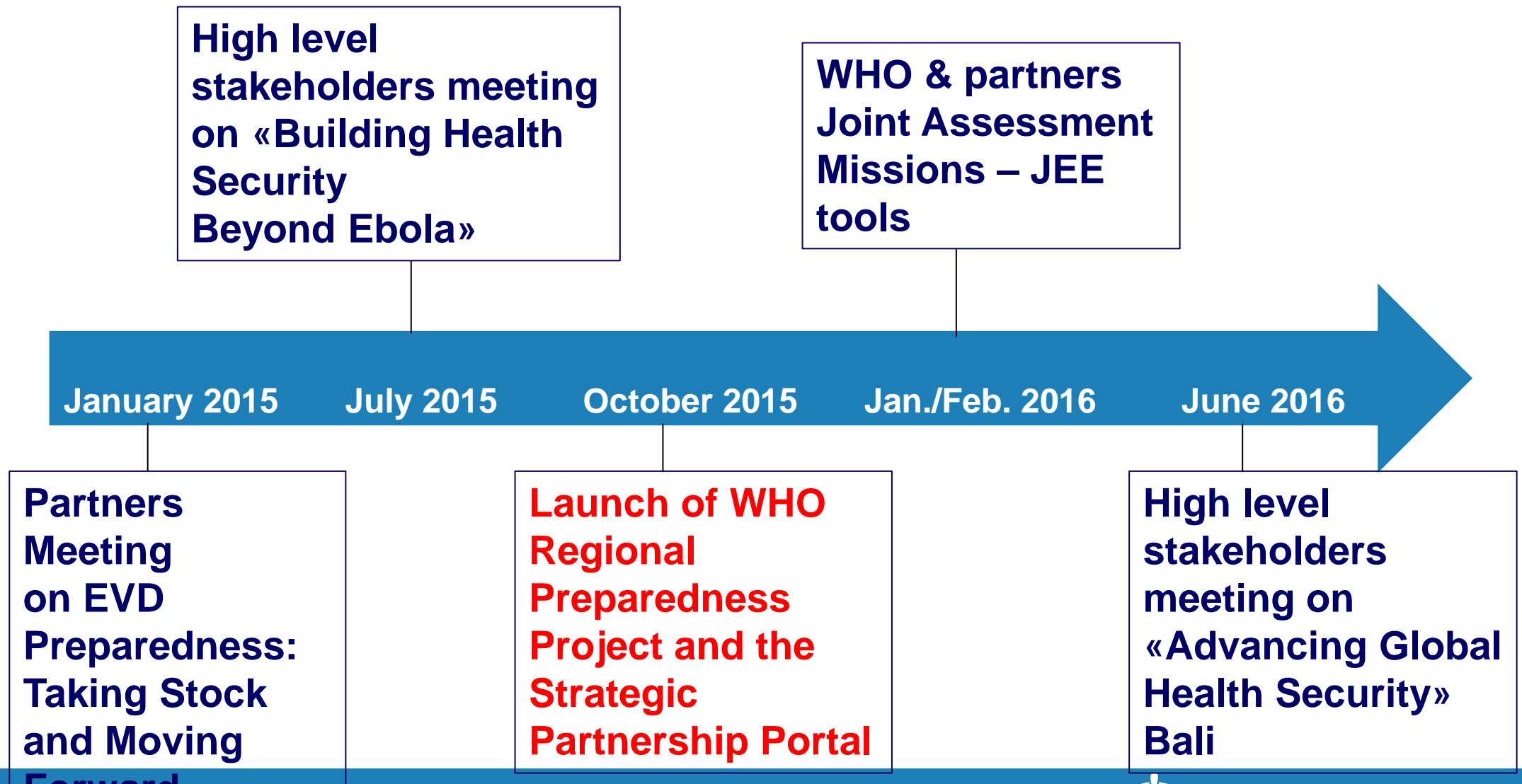


# Joint External Evaluation (JEE)

- Aim:
  - Determine the valid and valuable 2016 status of IHR/GHSA core capacities required for implementing the IHR 2005
  - Develop a focused prioritized plan of action that addresses the gaps identified in the Joint GHSA/IHR assessment
- Lesson learnt: JEE brought all stakeholders together , in assessment, scoring and development of joint priority actions
  - Ensured ownership of the whole process by the Government.
  - Enhance adaptation of incident management system & multisectoral coordination
  - One health and Whole of Society approach

# MOH JEE Way forward

- Tanzania will develop a multiyear National Plan to show how the country will improve the 19 identified packages following JEE recommendations through a consultative process: stakeholders planning workshop & donor / partners meeting
- A comprehensive, time-phased prioritized IHR Action Plan 2016-17 have been developed following the JEE
- Implementation of the JEE priority activities at sub national level
- Strengthen PHEOC and IMS and implementation of the AP
- Involvement of Zanzibar to conduct their JEE and have a plan of action
