

Ebola: Govt orders regional secretaries to set up clinical desks at all boarder posts

- Two suspected patients were Ebola free
- But are under special care in separate wards
- Thermo scanners ordered for KIA and JNIA airports

THE government has instructed regional administrative officers to set

up clinical desks at all boarder points for testing people entering Tanzania in a bid to keep Ebola pandemic at bay.

The drive comes amid reports that two people suspected of contracting the

disease entered the country this week, though the government said they were diagnosed with fever.

However, the government stated that the suspected patients were now hospitalised

in isolated wards.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare Spokesperson, Nsachris Mwamwaja said there is no Ebola patient in the country and that the government is

alert about the matter.

"The ministry received information that there were two patients who suspected to be suffering from Ebola. But after medical examination, it was discovered that one of

them was suffering from fever due to malaria while the other had other diseases, and not Ebola as reported by some media," he said.
