

# Husband of missionary with Ebola returns to US under quarantine

**WINSTON-SALEM, N.C.**

THREE missionaries, including the husband of a missionary being treated for Ebola in Atlanta, will be temporarily quarantined in North Carolina to ensure they did not contract the deadly virus while in Liberia, their Christian group said on Monday.

SIM USA worker David Writebol and two doctors who have been caring for Ebola patients in Monrovia amid the current outbreak arrived in Charlotte by private charter Sunday night, the mission organization said in a statement. Writebol's wife, Nancy, is one of two American relief workers with Ebola being treated at Emory University Hospital.

SIM USA said a total of five adults and six children from the group brought back from West Africa are being housed in recreational vehicles in a private area on its campus in Charlotte.

None of the missionaries have shown signs of being infected with the disease, the group said. The virus has killed nearly 1,000 people in West Africa and is the worst outbreak on record.
