Public Private Partnership

- Office established at the MoHSW HQ
- Designated officer and TA
- Public Private Partnership TWG by December 2009
Currently with 13 partner members from both public and private health sectors and development partners
- Monthly meetings to facilitate stakeholder interaction and guide PPP implementation

Public Private Partnership

HSSP III

- Public Private Partnerships-Strategy 6 to be implemented under HSSP III.
- Three strategic objectives within PPP Strategy
 - 1) To ensure a conducive policy and legal environment for operationalization of PPP
 - 2) To ensure effective management and Operationalization PPP development
 - 3) To enhance PPPs in the provision of health and Nutrition/social welfare services

Public Private Partnership

Strategic Objective 1

To ensure conducive policy and legal environment to facilitate PPPs

- Final draft Health Sector PPP Strategic Plan
- Service Agreement Template in use
- PPP Policy guidelines for health sector drafted

PPP Strategic Objective 2

To ensure effective operationalization of PPP

- Nat'l PPP Workshop for Zonal Representatives held
- Several Regional PPP Forum meetings held
 - Arusha, Kagera, Kigoma, Kilimanjaro, Morogoro, Mara, Mwanza, Rukwa, Shinyanga, Tabora and Tanga
- 2 Private Sector Health Providers meetings held in Dar es Salaam and Arusha in June and August 2010
 - Peer learning
 - Sharing relevant documents
 - Discussing common challenges/improvement
- Nine monthly national level PPP TWG meetings held
- PPP Stakeholder Workshop held in Bagamoyo
- Learning from other country(Ghana) done

Strategic Objective 3

To enhance PPP in the provision of health and nutrition/social welfare services

- Participation in the revision of CCHP Guidelines
- Councils/Regions sensitized on the importance of Service Agreements and performance based financing
- 12 Councils signing Service Agreement with private facilities to provide public health services
- Gov't staff salary payments within DDH and VA facilities
- Placement of public health workers within FBO facilities
- CSSC Costing Analysis introduced in 25 Hospitals, 9 Health Centres and 8 Dispensaries
- CIDA support to LGA & MSI in 13 Districts for RCH services
- Government grant to training institutions
- Private facilities provide preventives services

CHALLENGES

- Proper understanding of PPP as a new concept limited at LGA level
- Limited representation of all stakeholders in the PPP TWG/NPPPSC (PM-RALG, Private for Profit, Not for Profit, Civil Society)
- Standardization and regularization of costing tool for service agreement
- Harmonize support for PPP

Way forward:

- Alignment of Health Sector PPP Policy Guidelines and other relevant document
- Advocate for operationalisation of PPP activities at zonal, regional, district level with full involvement of private sector
- Designing promotion messages to create awareness
- Advocacy for standardized costing tool for SA
- Development of appropriate tracking framework

Way forward..:

- Country assessment of Private Health Sector
- Initiation of Regional and District PPP forums
- Develop and disseminate Regional/District PPP committee guidelines
- Develop training manual
- Involve more stakeholders in PPP TWG/NPPPSC
