

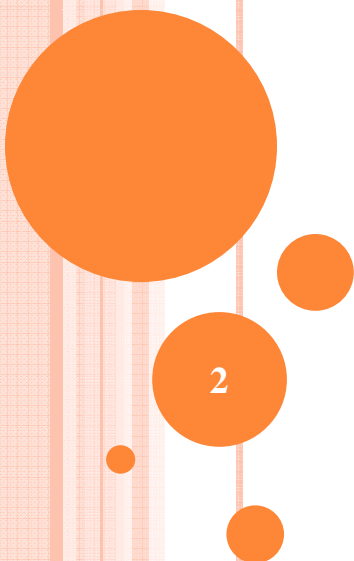

BACKGROUND

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- ✓ The Health Sector Strategic Plan III (2009-2015) features three strategies dealing directly with decentralization:
 - District Health Services
 - Referral Hospital Services
 - Central Level Support including RHMT

The TWG No. had four milestones to oversee its implementation- Milestones No 2, 3 and 11

STRATEGY NO 1: DISTRICT HEALTH SERVICES

Strategic Objectives

1. Increase accessibility to health services based on equity and gender balanced needs.
2. To improve quality of health services
3. To strengthen management of District Health Services

Implementation status will be reflected in the analysis and summary of the CCHP 2011/2012

DISTRICT HEALTH SERVICES

- Progress has been made in several areas, which includes the following:
 - Finalization of revision of CCHP guideline
 - Finalization of revision of CHSB guideline
 - Review of the reporting system (incl. planrep and epicor)
 - Preparation of analysis and summary of annual CCHP implementation report 2009/2010 and
 - Analysis and summary of annual CCHP plans 2011/2012

DISTRICT HEALTH SERVICES..

- **Milestone No 2:** The CCHP guideline have been revised and finalized in line with Health Sector Strategic Plan III (2009- 2015), MKUKUTA and other agreed Sector strategies .
- The CCHP guideline was used by LGAs to develop their annual CCHP2011/2012.
- The CCH plans 2011/2012 have been analysed and consolidated. The analysis and summary will be presented

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COUNCIL HEALTH SERVICES BOARDS AND HEALTH FACILITY GOVERNING COMMITTEES (CHSB & HFGC)

Milestone No 11

- Guidelines for establishment of CHSB have been revised and pretested in 14 regions (3 councils per each)

STRATEGY NO2: REGIONAL REFERRAL HOSPITAL SERVICES

Strategic Objectives

1. Increase access for patients in need of advanced and specialised medical care
2. Improve quality of clinical services in hospitals
3. Improve management of the hospitals through the implementation of Hospital Reform Program
4. Strengthen hospital governance

GOVERNANCE

Achievements:

- 21 (91.3%) regional referral hospitals have been sensitized out of currently 23 on RRABs
- 15 (71.4%) RRHs have RRAB boards in place with different level of functioning out of 21 sensitized
- 4 (26.7%) RRH boards have been oriented
- All Council Hospitals have health Facility Governing Committees at different levels of implementation

MANAGEMENT

- Achievement:
 - Training Modules revised
 - 18 Zonal Facilitators trained on Hospital planning
 - All 23(100%) planned RRHs-HMTs trained and coached on planning (Strategic and Annual Operational Plans)
 - 23 RRHs (100%) produced Strategic and Annual Operational Plans

SYSTEMS

- **Achievements:**
 - HMIS: improvement on-going + initiatives such as Hospital benchmark project
 - FAMS: guideline under preparation + initiatives such as in Tanga Region
 - PBF/P4P: several initiatives(PBF in Rungwe District) and P4P being piloted in Coast region

QUALITY OF CARE

Achievements:

- Updated Quality Improvement Framework
- Review of guideline for Basic Standard for health facilities
- 20 Regional Referral Hospitals and 7 Council Hospitals staff trained and implements (5S - CQI) continuous quality improvement
- Follow up and supervision of 4 RRHs with established ICU, 6 RRHs and 9 council hospitals with PPM

REGIONAL REFERRAL HOSPITAL SERVICES

○ Milestone No 3

- The 3 training material -Planning, Management and quality improvement were revised and improved by end of October 2010
- The training/coaching sessions to 14 Regional Referral Hospitals took place in April 2011
- The tailored coaching of 9 RRHs took place in 2010/ 2011
- Guidance by RHMTs to Council hospitals planning teams was conducted during preparation of the CCHP.

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CENTRAL LEVEL SUPPORT INCLUDING RHMT

- Capacity Building to RHMTs continued with the support of JICA through TC RRHM- Project
- Planning and reporting guide for RHMT developed and in use. Guidelines in finalization
- All Senior positions for RHMT officially filled
- TC RHM phase Two to give capacity to RHMT to supervise CHMTs

1.4 PROGRESS MADE BY THE DISTRICT AND REGIONAL TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP No.1

- The group has been very active since its inception.
- It has met 13 times deliberating many issues pertaining to the delivery of the health services, issues concerning DHS, RRHs, RHMTs, CHSBs and HFGCs.
- And other tasks assigned by TC SWAP/ BFC.
- Collaborate with other TWG through some members of our working group are also members of other TWG such as E&E, MNCH, HRH, HCF, etc.

1.5 CHALLENGES

- ◉ Shortage of skilled staff and financial resources
- ◉ Financing gap between actual needs and allocation
- ◉ Inadequate capacity building in planning, data analysis and reporting
- ◉ Delayed disbursement of funds causes delayed implementation

1.6 WAY FORWARD AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Orientation of the CHPTs and RHMTs on the revised CCHP guidelines and PlanRep.
- Revised CCHP guidelines to be included in the Planrep software.
- Facilitate of 8 RRHABs and orientation of 19 RRHABs

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1.6 WAY FORWARD AND RECOMMENDATION...

- Strengthen partnerships
- Promote innovative initiatives
- Improve access to resources
- Facilitate progresses on essential frameworks (technical)
- Finalize and disseminate National Package of Essential Health Interventions and the National Basic Standard Guidelines for Health Facilities
