Strategic Objective-1



- Increase access to maternal, newborn and child health services

Expected Results

- ❑ Number of Health facilities providing quality Maternal, Newborn and Child Health services (MNCH)
- ❑ Referral systems at all levels in place
- ❑ Community Participation in place



Strategic Objective-2



- Strengthen health systems to provide quality Maternal Newborn Child Health (MNCH) and Nutrition Services

Expected Results

- Policies, guidelines and capacity development and supervision of MNCH and health facilities
- Availability of essential equipment and supplies
- Linkage with other health programmes is improved to deliver services in integrated way



Current Status of Implementation

Indicators

- Maternal Mortality- 454/100,000 live births
- Contraceptive Prevalence Rate 36% all methods, 28% modern methods (Total Fertility Rate 5.4). (TDHS 2009/10)
- 50.6% health facility delivery coverage
- Antenatal Care attendance <16wks- 46%
- Antenatal Care attendance at least 4 visits **62%**
- Insecticide Treated Net coverage in pregnant women 57%



Current Status of Implementation

Indicators

- Under-five Mortality Rate- 81/1000 live births
- Infant Mortality Rate-51/1000 live births
- Neonatal Mortality Rate -26/1000 live births

- 91% coverage for measles vaccination
- 85% coverage DPT-HB-HiB3, TT coverage 82%



Current Status of Implementation

Indicators

- Insecticide Treated Net Coverage 64% in Under-five children
- Vitamin A coverage 94%
- 68% of HIV positive pregnant women receive ARV prophylaxis for (PMTCT)



Current Status of Implementation

- Number of Health facilities providing quality MNCH services 4,792 (80% of all health facilities) of these;
 - Family Planning services provided in 88%
 - Focused Antenatal Care 100%
 - Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV (79% of RCH clinics, 17% HIV Early Infant Diagnosis)
 - Integrated Management of Childhood Illness 74%
 - Vaccination 100%



Current Status of Implementation

- Fistula management 0.9%.
- Adolescent Friendly Sexual Reproductive Health services 25.4%

Referral systems at levels in place

- 32 ambulances procured and distributed to Dodoma, Kagera, Kigoma, Lindi, Coast and Rukwa regions
- Procurement in process for 400 motorcycle ambulances.



Current Status of Implementation

Community Participation in place

- ❑ Reviewed Community -IMCI guidelines
- ❑ Developing integrated MNCH community package

Policies, guidelines and capacity development and supervision of MNCH and health facilities

- Launch of National Family Costed Implemented Programme, and development of Adolescent Reproductive Health Strategy,



Current Status of Implementation

- Revised Life Saving Skills, Family Planning, Focused Antenatal Care , Kangaroo Mother care, training packages

Guidelines for;

- ❑ Cervical Cancer Prevention and Control,
- ❑ Policy guidelines on Management of Gender Based violence.
- ❑ Essential newborn care guidelines,
- ❑ Postnatal care guidelines



Current Status of Implementation

Policies, guidelines and capacity development and supervision of MNCH and health facilities

- Life Saving Skills /Focused Antenatal Care – (>800 HW trained)
- Family Planning – (> 470)
- Paediatric Hospital Initiative (> 228 HW)
- PMTCT, (>2000 HW)
- Helping Babies Breathe- Roll out (> 600 HW)
- Kangaroo Mother care (11 sites)
- Supervision



Current Status of Implementation

Availabilities of essential equipment and supplies

- Maternal Newborn Child Health equipment
 - World Bank, Aus-AID, SDC, UN- JP2, UN- JP6,
 - WHO-EC/ MoHSW,
 - Basket, CCHP's, Global fund round 7

- Family Planning commodities –
 - USAID, UNFPA



Current Implementation Status



Linkage with other health interventions is improved to deliver services in integrated way

- ❑ Integrated PMTCT/MNCH proposal submitted in round 10
- ❑ Family Planning /HIV integration
- ❑ Ongoing process to strengthen integrated Maternal Newborn Child Health services delivery



Future Plans



- Strengthen integrated MNCH services
 - Develop tools and job aids
 - Integrated RMNCH supervision
 - Strengthen RCH zonal supervision
 - Integrated community MNCH package

- Strengthen availability of EMoNC and paediatric equipment and supplies
 - Focus on Basic and Comprehensive EMoNC at health centre and hospital levels in next year



Future Plans



- ❑ Delivery pack distribution to begin in two regions
- ❑ Strengthen cold chain storage capacity for vaccines

- Conduct Emergency Obstetric Newborn Care assessment in 6 regions
- Continue effort to strengthen referral
- Through districts and partners continue to;
 - ❑ Upgrade health centres to provide comprehensive Emergency Obstetric Care
 - ❑ Build maternity waiting homes



Future Plans



- Strengthen Family planning and other Reproductive Child Health commodity security
- Finalize MNCH guidelines and curricula in development

- Continue capacity building of health workers
- Continue Advocacy and resource mobilization for MNCH at all levels



Future Plans



- Launch Campaign for Accelerated Reduction of Maternal Mortality in Africa in Tanzania
- Strengthen monitoring and evaluation for MNCH
- Strengthen cervical cancer prevention and control
 - To finalize Strategy, Policy guidelines, training guidelines
 - Begin preparations for introduction of vaccine
